**The subject of the letter** must indicate: Conference: foreign language.

In the letter, write the following information: full name of the author, full name of the scientific supervisor, title of the article and name of the section.

**No more than 5 articles** are accepted from one scientific supervisor.

### **Requirements to the articles**

Minimum article volume is 3 full pages; maximum article volume is 6 full pages (*file naming example*: Smith\_article);

Microsoft Word, A4 page format, margins: top, left, right are 2.5 cm, bottom is 3 cm, font is Times New Roman 14, line spacing is single, first line indent is 1 cm, full justification, book orientation, without page numbers, without hyphenation and page references.

**1. The first line** contains the author's first name and surname (the font is not bold).

For example: George Smith;

**2. The second line** contains the title of the article (in the language of the article) that should be centered, without indentation, in capital letters, the font is bold.

For example: if the language of the article is English, the title will be **THE PROBLEM OF TRANSLATING TERMS FROM ENGLISH INTO GERMAN IN SCIENTIFIC TEXTS**;

**3. The third line** contains the full name of the university (in lowercase letters, font is italic, not bold).

For example: *Berlin Technical University*;

**4. The fourth line** contains the scientific supervisor's first name and surname, his position, academic degree and academic rank.

For example: Scientific supervisor –

Doctor of Philological sciences, Professor Thomas Brown

Candidate of Philological Sciences, Associate Professor Oleg Ivanov

**5. Blank line**

**6. Abstract** (no more than 60 words)

**7. Key words:** (4-5 words)

Abstract and key words should be of 12 font size, without indentation, with full justification, lowercase). The words *Abstract* and *Key words* should be italic and bold.

**8. Blank line**

**9. The main text of the article** (full justification, first line indent is 1 cm)

Bibliographical references in the main text of the article should be in square brackets with the serial number of the work in the list of references and the specific page the cited text is located on. Information is separated by a colon. For example: [10: 81].

The list of references (centered, without indentation) is presented in alphabetical order. Please do not refer to Wikipedia.

**An additional requirement** is not to use illustrations in articles. Tables should be created in MS Word.
